



- ❖ Pressler Road Park: 5.4 acres
- ❖ Lower Park: 13 acres
- ❖ Cemetery: 1.2 acres
- ❖ Trail Easements: 6 acres
- ❖ Orondorf Nature Preserve: 14 acres
